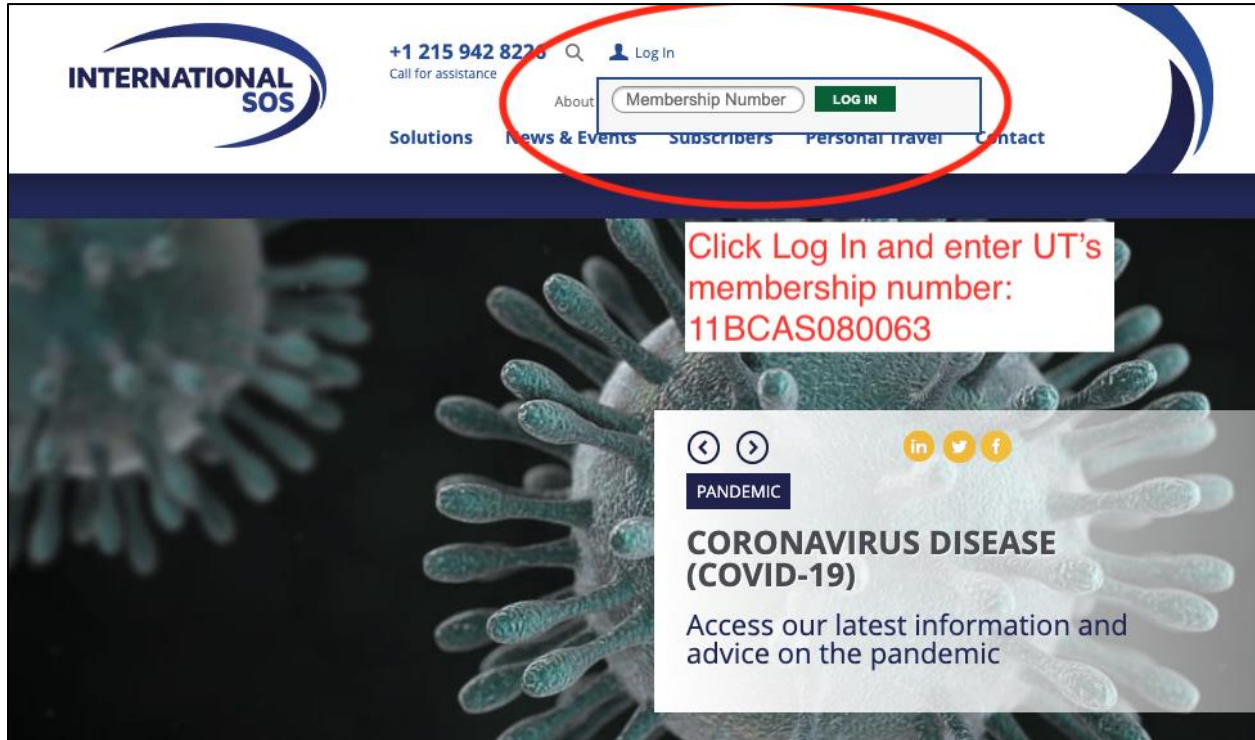
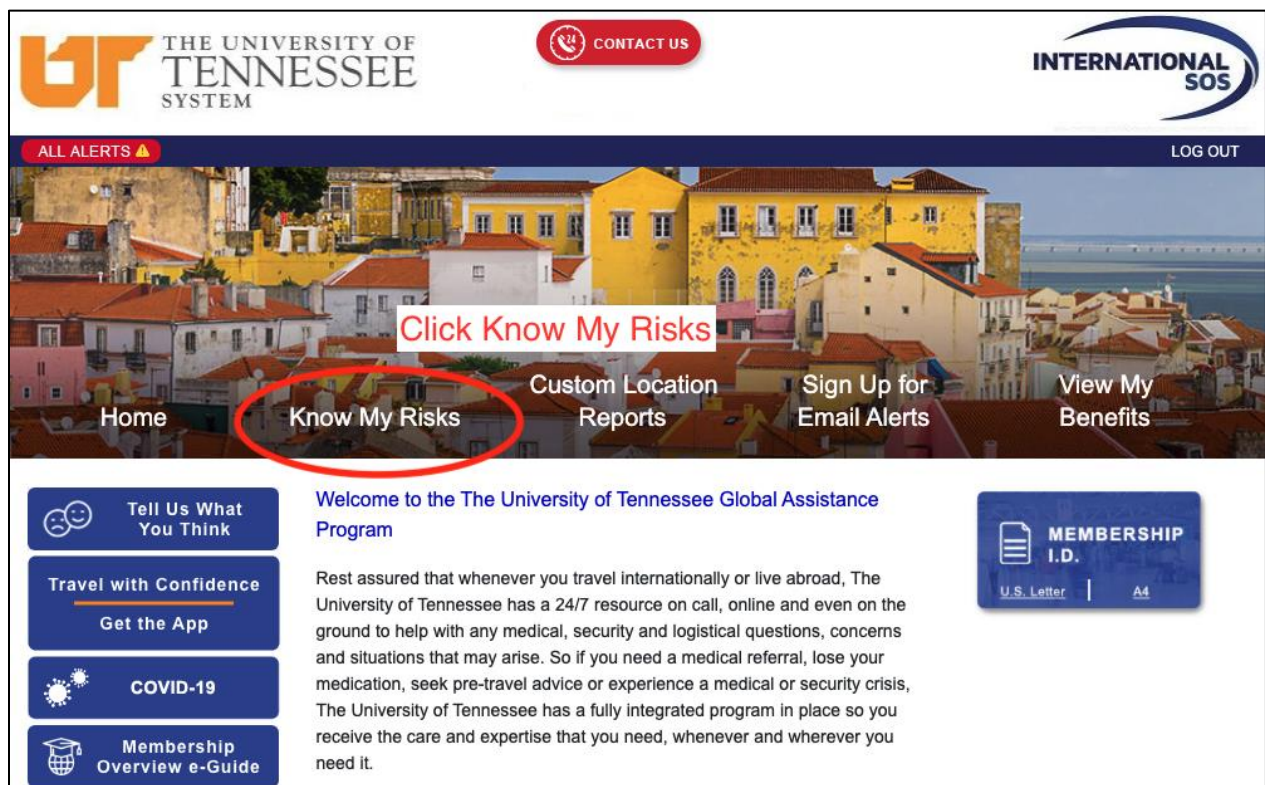


Identifying destination risks using International SOS

1. Go to internationalsos.com and click “Log In” at the top. Enter UT’s membership number: 11BCAS080063.



2. Once logged in, click “Know My Risks”.



3. Select destination from the drop-down menu. The destination-specific page should then automatically load.
