Ambassador Hilda Suka-Mafudze is the Permanent Representative of the African Union to the United States of America. Ambassador Suka-Mafudze leads the coordination of the AU – U.S.A. Bilateral relationship, which is built around the 22 Core Functions aimed: to develop, maintain, undertake resource mobilization, and consolidate constructive and productive institutional relationships between the African Union and Africans in the Diaspora, the Bretton Woods Institutions – the International Monetary Fund and the World Bank, and all the agencies of the government of the United States of America.

A Zimbabwe national. Prior to coming to the U.S. to assume the current position, she helped lead diplomacy for more than two decades in a variety of top government positions in her home country – Zimbabwe.

Holding ambassadorial positions representing her country in Khartoum Sudan and South Sudan between 2010 and 2019, and most recently in the Republic of Malawi.
